Impact Story: Patricia Nakato

Patricia grew up as one of eight children raised by a single mother who cleaned other families' homes to provide for her children. When school fees couldn't be paid, Patricia was sent home from class.

"I worried that my passion for design would remain just that," she wrote, "a dream tucked away in a sketchbook I couldn't afford to fill."

Everything changed when True to Africa began sponsoring her journey at just eight years old. With tuition, meals, bedding, and school materials covered through True to Africa and Child2Youth Foundation, Patricia moved steadily forward through primary school, through secondary, and finally through the gates of Kyambogo University, where she earned a degree in Computer Graphics and Design. Her C2Y social worker Susan noted that Patricia was "well disciplined and organized" throughout her years of study.

"You didn't just provide materials," she wrote to her sponsors. "You provided peace of mind." Patricia is now a graduate actively seeking her first professional role and ready to give back. Her journey from a child sketching in notebook margins to a university-trained designer shows what becomes possible when given the chance to succeed.
